## "POP GOES THE WEASEL"

Tucson Greyhound Park's Player Development Manager is Dave "The Weasel" Robinson. With more than thirty years of greyhound racing experience, Weasel's handicapping knowledge and tips are a must for beginner and experience wagerer alike.

Affectionately called, "The Weasel" Dave hails from West Virginia. He is a former kennel owner and has raced and trained outstanding greyhound athletes in West Virginia and in Phoenix, Apache Junction and Tucson, Arizona.

Dave retired from kennel ownership in 1994 due to health considerations. He also realized he could "make more money gambling than racing."

Tucson Greyhound Park is proud to share "The Weasel's" insight and wisdom through this Handicapping Guide. To quote "The Weasel:" "They aren't great dogs, they are greyhound athletes."

## WHAT IS HANDICAPPING?

Webster's Dictionary defines *handicap* as "a race or contest in which an artificial advantage is given or disadvantage imposed on a contestant to equalize chances of winning." It defines a *handicapper* as "one who predicts the winners in a race for publication."

"The Weasel's" definition of *handicapping* is: "Determining an individual greyhounds characteristics, racing patterns and opportunities. These, plus other ingredients will provide an advantage/disadvantage to the greyhound and wagerer in any given race.

To add to "Weasel's" definition, *handicapping* also includes evaluating breaking ability, running style and situations that a greyhound cannot control. These may include:

Post Positions which are computer assigned on a rotating basis. Each greyhound has an equal chance of garnering the prime post positions. The **one** and **eight** post positions are the prime positions as those greyhounds have the better chance of avoiding bumping and blocking while jockeying for the route to the winner's circle.

Weasel further believes that the number **five** position or "middle of the field" is the next best place in a race as this greyhound has a straight shot around the track.

He also adds that a greyhound's racing style is extremely consistent. If a greyhound likes to run the inside rail, that greyhound will run to its preferred place at all risks, including bumping and blocking. The same theory applies if a greyhound prefers running outside.

Racing greyhounds cannot control other obstacles including course distance and conditions, inclement of weather and their competitor's racing characteristics.

## WHY IS HANDICAPPING IMPORTANT?

Simply put, the best greyhound doesn't always win. The greyhounds with the best racing advantage are usually the winners. Every greyhound with the best combination of ability and opportunity is the likely winner.

## HOW CAN HANDICAPPING HELP?

Handicapping will help you gain more consistent and larger payouts. It will also provide you with:

- the ability to select winners and eliminate non contenders with accuracy.
- a basis to develop a personal winning wagering system.
- a basic reference point allowing enhanced wagering knowledge.
- An ability to be more efficient in your picks with a lower margin of error.

It is important to relax and enjoy yourself with your new knowledge. Don't beat your head against the wall if you make an error. Handicapping is much like learning to ride a bike. At first you make some falls. But once the skill is mastered you will soar!

## HANDICAPPING AND TECHNOLOGY

With current technology, a race can be easily handicapped to determine which is the best greyhound through the computer picks. Information about the race is input into the computer by class, record, speed, break and finish. The computer then calculates the four best greyhounds.

Weasel has followed the computer picks and has discovered that the computer's percentage of accuracy in selecting winning Quinielas is 62%. Trifectas accuracy are about 36% and Superfectas are 23%.

If you combine the computer picks along with your own assessment of the race you will increase your chances of cashing more winning tickets.

The computer picks are found on the bottom left corner of your program. Keep an eye on them and you will understand Weasel's theory. It will definitely help your personal handicapping.

## STYLES OF BETS

There are diverse styles of betting. Formulas that are popular with the less knowledgeable players can actually be successful. Although our intent is to assist you in a knowledgeable wagering system, we do not want you to overlook your personal "hunch."

Lucky numbers are a very popular method of wagering. Everyone has what they consider to be their lucky number(s). These could include their own birthday, anniversary or child's birth. A well known greyhound handicapper uses his birthday in a quiniela box and claims he is relatively successful with this wager.

## SUPERFACTA

Similar to the Superfecta, the Trifecta with the exception that you select four greyhounds to finish in an exact order. As with the Trifecta, there are so many combinations, the payoffs are generally not listed on the track toteboard or television sets. The minimum wager is usually \$2, however, keep in mind that it is best to purchase tickets in \$1 increments.

## SUPERFACTA BOX

If you would like to Box a Superfecta, select the four or more greyhounds you believe will finish in their exact order. As an example, if your choices are the #1-3-5-7, ask the mutuel tellers for a "\$1 Superfecta Box 1-3-5-7." The cost for this wager is \$24.

## SUPERFACTA WHEELS AND PART WHEELS

With a Superfecta Wheel and Part Wheel, you are able to Wheel one greyhound with three or more greyhounds for the Second, Third and Fourth positions. As an example: You have selected the #1 greyhound to wheel with 3-5-6-7. Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Superfecta Wheel 1 with the 3-5-6-7." The cost will be \$24.

If you would like to Wheel or Key one greyhound for Second, Third or Fourth place you will want to ask for a Part Wheel.

As an example: You would like to Wheel #1 to come in Second with the 3-5-6-7. Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Superfecta Part Wheel 3-5-6-7 with 1 with 3-5-6-7 with 3-5-6-7." The cost will be the same as a Wheel as you are using only one Key greyhound. If you would like to Wheel more than one greyhound in any position you will want to use the Part Wheel.

For example; you want a 1-2 with 1-2 with 3-4 with ALL. Your four choices are the #1-3-5-7. The 1 or 2 must finish First or Second; the 5 or 7 must finish Third; and ANY dog may finish Fourth. Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Superfecta Part Wheel, 1-2 with 1-2 with 5-7 ALL." The cost is \$20.

Again, the following charts are for your First, Second, etc. choices.

Kennels are very creative when naming their greyhounds. Novice gamblers often make their choices based on the name of the greyhound.

Another style of wagering that we cannot overlook is called "the pisser." The basis of this style is watching the greyhound during the post parade. Many sincerely believe the greyhound that relieves itself prior to the race may have a distinct advantage.

Tucson Greyhound Park is extremely proud of its kennels. Our kennels are rated high in the greyhound racing industry. It is common to find gamblers that bet only on one particular kennel or trainer.

Any of the above styles of magical, mystical formulas or logic may well be valid. We encourage you to be creative in your wagering while using our handicapping techniques.

### THE BEST BET

The question most often asked of "The Weasel" is "What is the best bet?" His response is "the wager that returns the highest profit." Weasel generally recommends the Quiniela. To win a Quiniela wager you must pick the two greyhounds that finish in first and second place—you win regardless of the order. Weasel believes the quiniela to be the perfect wager for a variety of reasons:

- Your pick may be wrong but you may still collect because long shots occasionally win.
- The win and place positions are more predictable than the show position.
- Quiniela payoffs are clear and are easily calculated by toteboard information.
- The odds of a Quiniela wager are reasonable at approximately 28 to 1.

The Quiniela is Weasel's patented response when conducting his betting seminars. The only sure way to know the best bet is to do homework.

We will now explore basic and exotic wagers. Wagers will be defined and you will be provided with the cost of placing your wagers.

### THE "1/8<sup>TH</sup>" CALL

Weasel believes the "1/8<sup>th</sup> Call" to be one of the most important factors in greyhound racing. He quotes an old saying: "the race is won at the 1/8<sup>th</sup> call and the race is paid at the finish line." The greyhound that reaches the "1/8<sup>th</sup> Call" first will finish in the money (win, place or show), approximately 85% of the time.

The "1/8<sup>th</sup> Call" is the break of the race to the first turn. It is considered the most important portion of the race due to the fact that if a greyhound encounters trouble (blocking, bumping, etc.), it will happen during the first 1/8<sup>th</sup> portion. This is when greyhounds will show aggressiveness in seeking its preference of track position. This aggression will create

bumping, blocking, stumbles and sometimes falls. Greyhounds will sometimes make adjustments to avoid problems and may pause, go off stride, and may run inside or wide. On average, these adjustments could cost a greyhound approximately one half of a second. This percentage may sound insignificant, however, when race times are evaluated, one half of a second generally separates the fastest from the slowest time.

To determine which greyhound has the best potential at the "1/8<sup>th</sup> Call" compare column three (1/8<sup>th</sup>) and column five (Finish Position) in your racing program. Evaluate all the races a greyhound has been entered for consistency and review the chart writer's comments. You will see the consistency of the "1/8<sup>th</sup> Call.

### HOW TO MAKE A BET

Placing a bet or wager is as easy as "A, B, C." When you are ready to place your wager and reach the teller mutuel window announce the track the, simply remember A, B, C:

**A** The Amount you want to wager. Example: \$2.

**B** The type of Bet. Example: Win, Place, Show, Quiniela, etc.

**C** Your Choice by the greyhound number.

Example: "I would like \$2 to Win on Number 5 at Tucson Greyhound Park."

Remember that you will also need to inform the mutuel teller which track you are wagering.

ALWAYS check your ticket(s) and money before leaving the mutuel window to make sure everything is correct.

Keep your tickets until the race has been declared Official. Then, take your winning ticket to any TGP mutuel teller and collect your payoff!

### BASIC WAGERS

#### \$2 Minimum

**Win:** You bet on the greyhound that you believe will come in first. You collect if your greyhound wins.

**Place:** You bet on the greyhound that you believe will come in second or first. You collect if your greyhound does finish first or second. With this wager, you payoff will be the "place" money even if your greyhound wins.

**Show:** You bet on a greyhound you believe will be in the money (win, place or show). With this bet, you collect the "show" payoff if your greyhound finishes first, second or third.

### UNDERSTANDING THE ODDS

The odds are determined by the wagerer's projections of which greyhound has the best chance to win. They are determined by how much money is being bet on each greyhound, right up to Post Time. The odds are displayed on the track tote board and television sets.

## TRIFECTA PART WHEEL

To Key one greyhound into the Second or Third position, you must use a Part Wheel. In the Trifecta Wheel example, you wheeled your #5 greyhound to come in First with the 1-3-6-7. If you wanted to bet your #5 dog to come in Second, you would ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Trifecta Part Wheel 1-3-6-7 with 5 with 1-3-6-7." The cost is the same as the Trifecta Wheel (\$12) as you are still using only one key greyhound.

With a Trifecta Part Wheel, you may play more than one choice for the First, Second and Third positions. Example: You have selected #1-3-4-5-7. A 12/123/12345 ticket would put #1-3 to come in First, #1-3-4 to come in Second, and #1-3-4-5-7 to come in Third. If your selections finish in those positions you will win the Trifecta. To place this wager, ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Trifecta Part Wheel 1-3 with 1-3-4, with 1-3-4-5-7." The cost is \$12.

The Trifecta Wheels, Part Wheels and Boxes charts again use the numbers 1-2-3 as your First, Second, etc. choices.

The lower the odds demonstrate the confidence of the wagerer's. For example, if a greyhound's odds are "2-1" (2 to 1), this means that the wagerer's believe that greyhound has a 33% chance of winning its race. If the odds were 6-5 (6 to 5), they believe that greyhound has a 45% chance of winning.

The wagerer's favorite will win approximately 33% of the time. It is important that you conduct your own evaluation prior to reaching your "final answer!" If the betting public has an approximate win prediction of 33%, that also translates to an error rate of 67%.

Put your calculators away! To assist you in reading the odds we have provided the following conversion chart which includes "Wins" and "Payoffs" up to 99 to 1.

## QUINIELA WAGERS BOX, WHEEL AND PART WHEEL

### Quiniela: (Minimum \$2)

In a basic or straight quiniela, you bet on two greyhounds to finish first and second. You collect if your greyhounds win and place regardless of the finishing order. The Quiniela possible payoffs are found on the track tote board and television sets.

As Weasel previous described, Quiniela wagers are easy to determine and can be an exciting and creative wager. From the basic/straight quiniela we move on to:

### Quiniela Box: (Minimum \$6)

A Quiniela Box is the selection of three or more dogs that you believe will have the best chance of finishing first and second. You win if any two of your dogs finish first and second in any order.

Example: You have selected the 1, 4 and 7 greyhounds as your top three choices. Inform the mutuel teller that you would like a "\$2 Quiniela Box 1-4-7."

### Quiniela Wheel: (Minimum \$8)

To "wheel" a Quiniela you are keying (or tying), one greyhound to two or more greyhounds in a given race. If you wish, you can even "wheel" or "key" your choice with all the other greyhounds in the race. You win if your "Key" greyhound is among the first two finishers, regardless of which other greyhound finishes in First or Second place.

Example: You have selected the #5 greyhound with the #1, 3, 6 and 7 greyhounds. Inform the mutuel teller that you would like a \$2 Quiniela Wheel—Key the 5 with 1,3,6,7."

### Quiniela Part Wheel: (Minimum \$14)

The Quiniela Part Wheel is basically the Quiniela Wheel, except you are able to "key" more than one dog in any position. Again, you win if your key greyhound is finishes First or Second.

Example: If wanted to "wheel" the #3 and #5 greyhound with the 5, 6, 7, and 8 greyhounds you would ask the mutuel teller for a "\$2 Quiniela Part Wheel 3-5 with 5, 6, 7 and 8.

*Please refer to the follow Quiniela charts. For the purpose of these charts, the numbers 1-2- 3-4, etc. used are for your first, second, third, etc. selections.*

### TRIFECTA

With a straight Trifecta, you must select the first three greyhounds to finish in their Exact order. As there are so many combinations, the payoffs are generally not listed on the track toteboard or television sets. The minimum wager for a Trifecta is \$1.

It is suggested that Trifecta tickets be purchased in multiples of \$1. If you would like a \$2 or \$3 Box or Wheel, ask for two or three \$1 tickets with the same combinations. Trifecta payoffs can be quite large and by having multiple \$1 tickets you may avoid a large IRS takeout.

### TRIFECTA BOX

To Box a Trifecta, select three or more greyhounds you believe have the best chance of finishing, First, Second and Third place. You win if your greyhounds finish in any order.

Example: You want to have the #1-4-7 greyhounds in your wager. Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Trifecta Box 1-4-7." The cost is \$6. (If you want to wager \$2, remember to ask for two \$1 Trifecta tickets).

### TRIFECTA WHEEL

When you Wheel a Trifecta, you are tying or Keying one greyhound to two or more greyhounds in a race. You may Wheel or Key your choice all the other greyhounds if you choose. You win if your greyhound comes in First with the other two finishers, regardless of which other greyhounds take the Second or Third place position.

Example: You would like to Wheel the #5 with the #1-3-6-7. Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$1 Trifecta Wheel. Key the 5 with the 1-3-6-7." The cost is \$12.

## DAILY DOUBLE WHEEL

You have selected one greyhound in the First race that you want to play with five dogs in the Second race. This would be what is called a Daily Double Wheel. You would Wheel or Key your greyhound with the others. Your Key greyhound must win the First race. If any of your other choices win the Second race, you win the Daily double. A Back Wheel would be the exact opposite. You would choose one greyhound in the Second race with as many as you want in the First.

Example: Your selection in the First race is #5. You would like to Wheel it with the #1-3-4-9 in the Second Race. Ask the mutuel teller for a "Daily Double Wheel #5 in the First with 1-3-5-9 in the Second." Cost is \$8.

## DAILY DOUBLE PART WHEEL

A Part Wheel gives you the opportunity to bet as many dogs in the First race with as many as you want in the Second race. As an example, you like the #2-3-5 in the First and the #1-3-6 in the Second. Ask the mutuel teller for a "Daily Double Part Wheel 2-3-5 in the First with 1-3-6 in the Second." The cost is \$18.

The chart lists the Daily Double Wheel and Part Wheel Combinations. The numbers 1-2-3, etc. are used as your first, second, etc. choices.

## EXACTA

In a straight Exacta, you must choose the two greyhounds finishing First and Second in the exact order. The possible payoffs are listed on the track tote board and television sets. The minimum wager is \$1.

## EXACTA BOX

Boxing an Exacta reverses your bet both ways, so that your First and Second choice can finish in any order! To Box an Exacta, select two or more dogs you think have the best chance of finishing First and Second. You win if any two greyhounds finish First or Second in any order!

Example: You want to include the #1 and #4 greyhounds in your wager. This would be a two greyhound Exacta Box. Your tickets would be 1-4, 4-1. Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$2 Exacta Box 1-4." The cost is \$4. If you wanted the 1-4-7, it would be a three dog Exacta Box which would give you a 1-4, 4-1, 1-7, 7-1, 4-7, and 7-4. The cost is \$12.

### EXACTA WHEEL

When you "Wheel" an Exacta, you are tying or "Keying" one dog to two or more dogs in the race. You could Wheel or Key your choice with all the other dogs in the race if you chose. You win if your "Key" dog comes in First with any of the others in Second position.

Example: You want to wheel the #5 to Win (or, on top) with the # 1-3-6-7 to come in Second (or, on the bottom). Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$2 Exacta Wheel, Key the 5 Over the 1-3-6-7." The cost is \$8.

### EXACTA PART WHEEL

This bet is basically the same as the Exacta Wheel, however, you can select more than one dog as your "Key" on the top or on the bottom. Example: You want to Key #1 and #4 greyhounds to come in First, over #1-4-6 to come in Second. This would be a 12/123 combination.

Ask the mutuel teller for a "\$4 Exacta Part Wheel with the 1-4 over the 1-4-6." You will have a 1-4, 1-6, 4-1, 4-6. The cost will be \$16.

The Exacta charts list the Exact Wheel, Part Wheels and Boxes. Again, the numbers 1-2-3 used in the charts are for your First, Second, etc. selections.

### DAILY DOUBLE

To win the Daily Double, you must select the winning greyhounds of both the First and Second race. Wagers are accepted *prior* to the First race only. The possible playoffs are posted on the track tote board and television sets prior to the start of the First race.

The basic 1 with 1 ticket (one greyhound in each race) costs \$2. If you would like to bet more than one greyhound in each race, you can purchase a Daily Double Wheel or Part Wheel. These will allow you to chose as many greyhounds in the First race with as many greyhounds as you want in the Second race.
